The Safety and Skill Development Foundation (SSDF) successfully conducted a **Training of Trainers (ToT)** and **Training of Assessors (ToA)** program under the **Basics of Safety and Health Requirements of BOCW Act 1996** at the **National Academy of Construction (NAC), ASTI–Pulivendula, YSR District**.

The ToT/ToA program focused on strengthening understanding and implementation of the **Building and Other Construction Workers (BOCW) Act, 1996**, with emphasis on statutory safety, health, and welfare provisions at construction worksites. The program covered hazard identification, preventive safety measures, worker registration, welfare benefits, and compliance responsibilities, enabling trainers and assessors to effectively promote **BOCW-aligned safety practices and legal compliance** in the construction sector.
