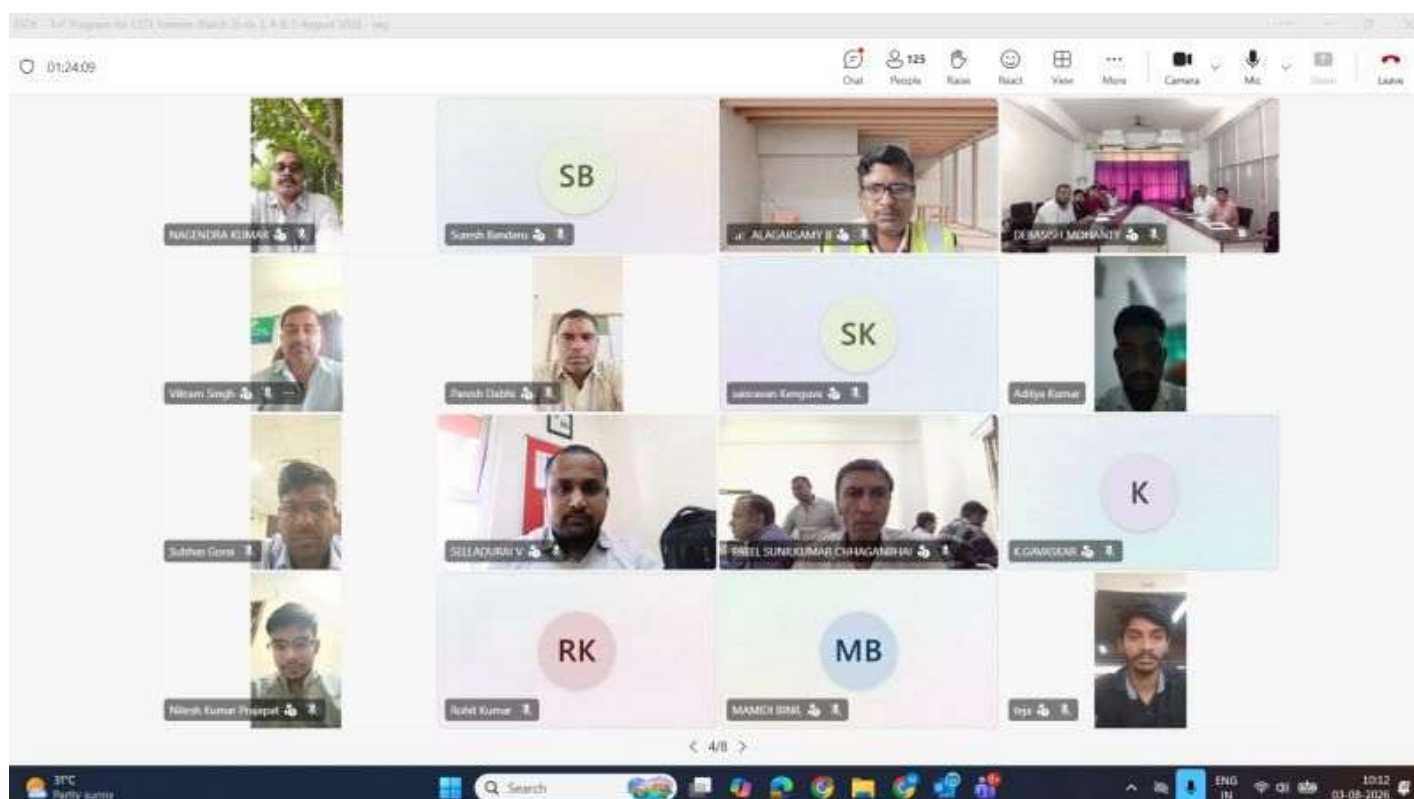
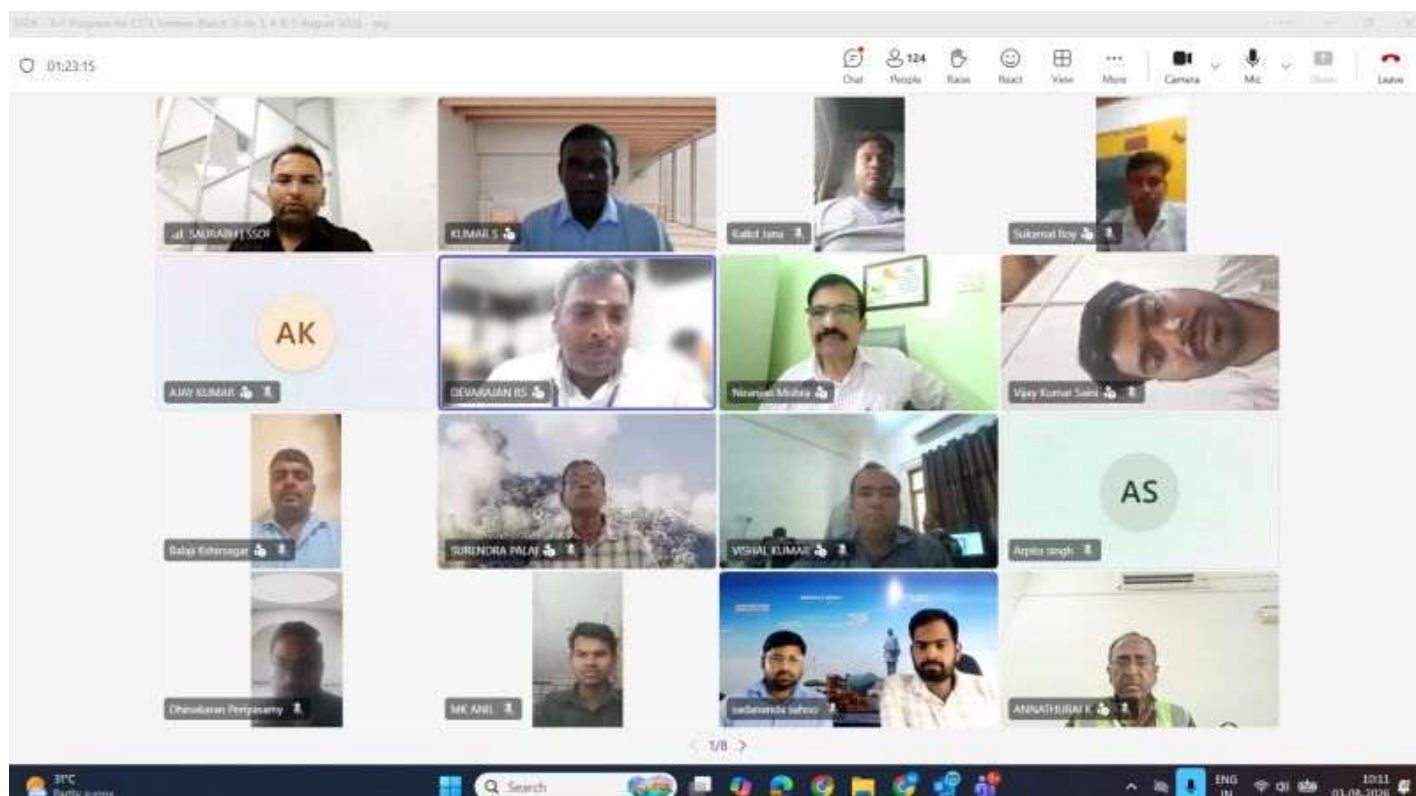
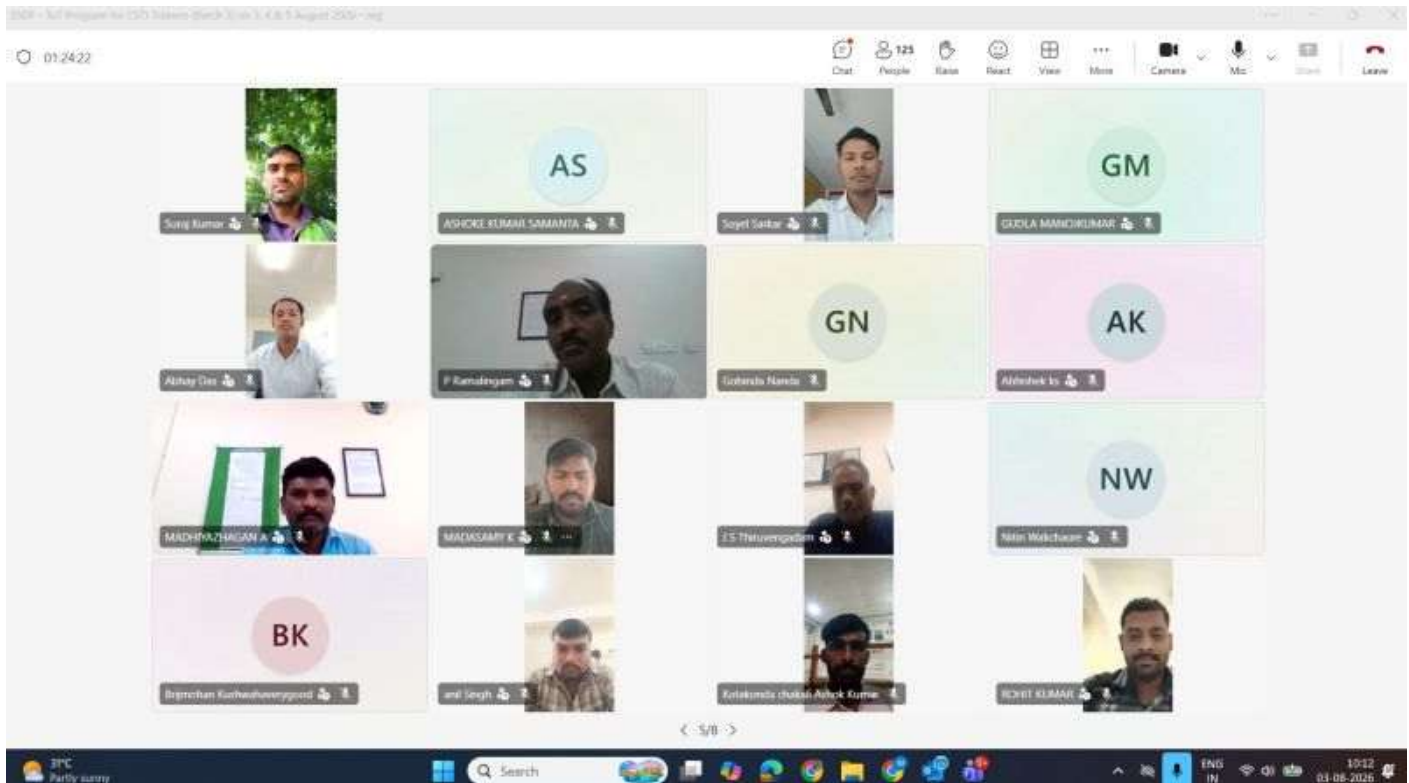

3–4 August 2026 | Construction Skills & Safety

Safety Skill Development Foundation (SSDF) successfully conducted a **Training of Trainers (ToT) Programme in collaboration with L&T on 3–4 August 2026**, bringing together trainers and assessors associated with key construction trades.

The programme was designed to strengthen the capacity of trainers and assessors to deliver **competency-based, industry-aligned training**, while integrating essential **EHS and safety practices** into construction skill development.

Key Components of the Programme
