Safety Skill Development Foundation (SSDF) carried out the **Online Training of Master Trainer / Training of Master Assessor (ToMT/ToMA) Programme for Traffic Safety Marshal – NSQF Level 2.5**.

The programme was designed to strengthen the capabilities of **Master Trainers and Master Assessors** in developing and assessing competencies related to traffic safety, vehicle and pedestrian movement, and safe traffic management practices.

Key Areas Covered

The programme focused on key competencies required for effective performance as a Traffic Safety Marshal, including:

- **Vehicle and Pedestrian Movement:** Managing and regulating movement in designated and high-traffic areas.
- **Traffic Hazard Identification:** Recognising traffic hazards and unsafe conditions and implementing preventive measures.
- **Traffic Control Measures:** Applying appropriate signs, signals, barricading and other traffic control measures.
- **Workplace and Construction Site Safety:** Supporting safe movement of vehicles and pedestrians around construction sites and workplaces.
- **Incident and Emergency Response:** Responding appropriately to traffic incidents and emergency situations.
- **Safe Road-User Behaviour:** Promoting safe driving practices and responsible road-user behaviour.
- **Safety Equipment:** Appropriate use of PPE and visibility equipment while performing traffic safety duties.
- **Communication and Coordination:** Maintaining effective coordination with drivers, workers and other stakeholders.
